Re: 2013 Air Quality Biannual Briefing Notes

Carrier Lumber Ltd. has maintained active participation in the PGAIR Society, the PGAIR Monitoring Working Group, and related program activities, including providing our share of funding to support the monitoring program and salaries of the Executive Director and support staff.

We continue to sustain the improvements made in recent years, including the following:

- An older model cyclone was replaced with a new version.
- An idling restriction protocol was implemented for company mobile equipment as well as contractor trucks hauling hog, shavings, pulp chips and lumber.
- We began purchasing bulk diesel fuel for mobile equipment that contains 5% ethanol, which results in reduced particulate emissions.
- We have defined and documented an action plan to respond to air quality advisories issued by MOE.
- We are a member of the Carbon Offsets Aggregation Cooperative (COAC), and have assisted COAC to develop its mobile equipment emissions reduction program by accommodating their representatives on our site to monitor mobile equipment operating practices.

In the past six months we have coordinated extensive maintenance to the asphalt at the Tabor site, which helps to mitigate airborne dust.
